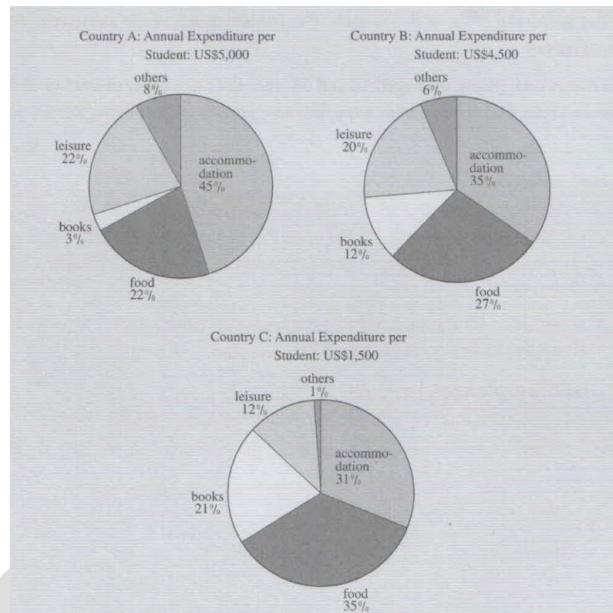


Task 1 **Pie chart**

Detail 3

With to country C, again lodging and food still made up the largest share. However, food spending housing payment, while the was true for the countries A and B. Also, whereas students in C spent of their money on books, those in B and A only spent one-tenth and one-thirtieth of their money.

Full sample

The given pie charts give a breakdown of university students' spending in three countries in 2003.

Overall, the average amount in A was the highest among three countries. Also, it is clear that students in each country spent the largest share of their money on lodging and food.

Students in country A spent in total \$5,000 per year. This number is just slightly higher than the figure for Country B (\$4,500) but is three times as much as that for Country C (\$1,500).

In A, altogether accommodation and food constituted more than 65% of students' spending. Next comes leisure activities and books at 22% and 3% respectively. The remaining 8% went to other activities. A quite similar spending pattern was seen in B. The only difference worth mentioning is the proportion of payment for books, which accounted for 12% in B, compared to just 3% in A.
