




Task 1

III. Body 1 (1868 – 1922)

1. Next to main road

Between 1868 and 1883, the village of Chorleywood was located next to one of the main roads.

2. Chorleywood Park + Golf Course

3. 1883 - 1922: South

4. 1909: railway + rail station
